




Macduff is a historic fishing village and town situated on Scotland's northeast coast in Aberdeenshire, opposite Banff across the River Deveron. With a rich maritime heritage shaped by fishing, shipbuilding, and trade, Macduff has been inhabited since Pictish times. It emerged as a distinct settlement in the 18th century, originally named Doune, before being renamed after the Duff family. James Duff, the 2nd Earl of Fife, played a key role in the town's growth, developing its harbour to support fishing and shipbuilding industries. In 1783, Macduff achieved the status of burgh of barony, solidifying its role as a trading hub.

The 19th century saw Macduff thrive as a fishing port, particularly in herring fishing, with shipyards constructing wooden vessels for both fishing and trade. The harbour's expansion and advancements in fishing techniques attracted workers from across Scotland, making Macduff a bustling maritime community. However, the 20th century brought challenges, including the decline of the herring industry and increased competition from larger ports. Macduff adapted by diversifying its economy, focusing on tourism, seafood processing, and maintaining a small but active fishing fleet. The Macduff Marine Aquarium, showcasing Moray Firth marine life, is a modern landmark celebrating the town's maritime connection.

Today, Macduff is a picturesque coastal town with a strong community spirit and an enduring fishing industry. Boats land a variety of seafood, including crab and lobster, while the harbour remains central to the town's identity. Tourism has become a significant contributor, with visitors drawn to its stunning coastal scenery, walking trails, and local festivals that celebrate its heritage. Macduff and its close neighbour Banff continue to play an integral role in the charm and culture of Scotland's northeast coastal region.

Macduff Pétanque Club: A Growing Legacy











Macduff Pétanque Club was officially formed in 2022, but the seeds of the idea were sown in late 2021 when Malcolm discovered an unused piece of ground at Macduff Bowling Club. With no money, just two members, a shovel, and a rake, the first piste was cleared. As interest grew, more pistes were needed, leading to the conversion of additional ground. Eventually, five pistes were established with the help of a startup grant from Clubsport Aberdeenshire and a generous donation of scalping from local builder Keith Simpson—creating what is now known as the lower terrain.





Beyond competitions, the club engages with the community, collaborating with local groups and schools, even bringing pétanque to Sandend Beach. In 2024, it hosted its first national event—the Men's and Women's Triples Championship. The club is now strengthening ties with new pétanque clubs while growing relationships with Boulers O'Birse and Fochabers, fostering passion for pétanque and a vibrant community.

By 2022, the club joined the Scottish Pétanque Association (SPA) and became Macduff Pétanque Club, also known as the Macduff Boule Sharks. Facebook promotion brought in new members from Ellon, Portsoy, Cullen, and Macduff, broadening its reach. Partnering with Active Schools, led by Malcolm, the club introduced pétanque to the Banff Academy Cluster, laying the foundation for a Junior Pathway. With ambitions to become a pétanque hub in Aberdeenshire, the club secured a National Lottery grant to develop the Upper Terrain, creating 10 new pistes with the help of John Warner, and Darren Morrison.



In 1989, the Scottish Pétanque Association accepted an invitation to play Wales in Cardiff, where Scotland emerged victorious. A return match was held in Stirling in 1990, and following a request from Northern Ireland to participate, the Celtic Challenge was officially formed. In 1991, the Irish Pétanque Association was established, and the 3rd Celtic Challenge took place in Clandeboyne, Northern Ireland

The Celtic Challenge is a two-day event in which each nation fields four teams of three or four players. The host nation also supplies an additional 'B' squad. The winner is determined by the team that secures the most victories across 12 rounds, ensuring every team competes against all opponents. On the opening day, the host nation's A and B squads face off in the first four rounds. With its blend of strong competition and a friendly, social atmosphere, the Celtic Challenge remains one of the most anticipated events in the pétanque calendar.
